

Adjectives and Adverbs

Adjectives:

- Adjectives describe the qualities of nouns.
- Adjectives come before the noun they describe OR after the verb "to be".
- Tuesdays are **busy** days at the warehouse.
- My company offers **amazing** benefits.
- We just left a **boring** meeting.
- My **boss** is **intelligent** and **kind**.
- The Q3 **report** is **long**.
- Our **team** is **talented** and **experienced**.

Adverbs:

- Adverbs describe a verb, an adjective, or another adverb.
- Adverbs come before an adjective or adverb. They can come before or after a verb.
- The meeting was **slightly** confusing.
- We were **almost** late to the event.
- I read the report **very** thoroughly.
- We planned the sale **very** carefully.
- Mia **asks** for my opinion **constantly**.
- My boss **usually** gives me a great bonus.

Describe an action you do at work. How do you do it? Describe the action with adverbs.

Examples: Clean, big, interesting, modern, useful, quiet, organized, important, common
